

“SUCCESS WITH HONOR” ANNUAL AWARDS PROGRAM

Friends of Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics Outstanding Contribution Award

The *Friends of Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics Outstanding Contribution Award* will be presented to an individual, group or company who:

- goes “above and beyond” the call of duty and significantly contributes to the successful operation of Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics
- exhibits initiative in continuous professional development and in further advancing Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics
- assists Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics in their Mission to provide what our student-athletes and staff would need to reach their highest potential on the field, in class or office and in representing the University as a whole

Eligibility:

Any individual, group, organization or company either within Penn State University or the surrounding Community. May not be currently a full-time (Staff Exempt, Staff Non-Exempt, Tech Service or Fixed Term I) employee of Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics including affiliates from the Morgan Center, Athletics Development and Sports Medicine. Past recipients of the award are eligible for nomination in the same category after five (5) years.

Nominations:

Any Intercollegiate Athletics staff member may nominate a candidate through an application form sent to Human Resources. Self-nominations will be accepted as well. Nominations are due no later than 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 15, 2014.

Selection Process:

A selection committee will be comprised of a Task Force with four (4) members, two (2) each from the Athletics Council for Diversity and Inclusion (ACDI) and TEAM ICA, who will evaluate and select the award winner(s) for the *Friends of Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics Outstanding Contribution Award*.

Award:

The recipient of the *Friends of Penn State Intercollegiate Athletics Outstanding Contribution Award* will be presented with a plaque at a luncheon during the Annual Spring Department Meeting in April/May and their name will be engraved on the “Success with Honor” awards plaque outside the Founder’s Room in the Bryce Jordan Center lobby.
